

Math Portfolio

Organization of the portfolio: Use a 2-inch 3-ring binder. The cover should have your name and class period. Neatness counts. Just having a portfolio is a first step, but one that is disorganized, messy, and that does not contain the required sections and content will receive a poor grade.

Use tabs to separate the portfolio into the following 6 sections (labeled as follows):

- (1) **Lesson Notes**: The minimum required content of this section is a copy of the class notes in summary form that I provide with each lesson.
- (2) **Math Properties**: I will provide a handout for the properties associated with a lesson (if any).
- (3) **Vocabulary**: I will provide the vocabulary words as a handout with the lesson (if any).
- (4) **Theorems**: I will provide a handout for any theorems associated with a lesson (if any).
- (5) **Functions**: There are 8 functions that we will study during the year. I provide a template on my website that, if filled in, will contain all of the required information.
- (6) **Formulas**: There will be some formulas that you will have to memorize. You will have to write in the formula for each lesson on a sheet of paper that you provide.
